PASTOR'S MESSAGE

On November second the citizen's of our nation voted to elect our leaders for the coming years. Some of us are happy with the results, others of us are not happy. Whatever our political viewpoint God instructs His people to do for certain at least three things regarding our government and our officials . First, from Romans 13, God says He expects us to obey the governing authorities. Their divinely appointed task is to restrain evil and keep the peace. When we obey the authorities we will not fear them . Next, God says, also in Romans 13, which Jesus teaches in Mark 12:17, that we have the responsibility to support our government by honorably paying our taxes (that is , not trying to avoid any payment, and not grumbling when

we pay them). By supporting our government we empower them to fulfill their responsibilities to God and to our nation. Finally, God instructs us to pray for our leader (I Timothy 1:1-2). That is why at Emmanuel each Sunday, in our intercessory prayers, we uphold all our leaders. We pray that God will grant them wisdom in their decision making and courage to do those things that are right , noble and honorable. Our leaders need our support, more importantly , God calls on us to support them. I urge you to include petitions in your personal devotions for our national, state, and local leaders.

Wittenberg Door ?

Congratulations to Jay Johnson. Jay is the member who named our newsletter. Why the Wittenberg Door you may be asking yourself?

The foundation of the Protestant Movement, and the Lutheran Church today is based on Martin Luther's Ninety-Five Theses, which he posted on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg Germany on October 31, 1517, arguing that the sale of indulgences for absolution of sin was a violation of the original intention of confession and penance. In those days, church doors were traditionally used as bulletin boards for posting information and celebration.

And so, this month, we bring you the first issue of Emmanuel Lutheran's newsletter, which is now named The Wittenberg Door.


