In the month of September our children and teachers return to school. At Emmanuel we are going back to basics. Sunday morning, September 9, at 9:00, Adult Bible Class and children's Sunday School begin. We will rally around the Lord as He speaks to us from His Holy Word. Adults will be studying the creation texts from Genesis and discussing the differences between the biblical worldview and the naturalistic of evolutionary worldview. *A Rich History of 66 years ..... Chapter eight*

In 1978 the church anticipated a year of change. Pastor Robert L. Peterson writes, “We have experienced strong support from our church members which have enabled us to grow in our evangelical outreach and develop new and effective worship and musical resources. We also have high hopes for some challenging new educational opportunities this summer and fall. There is growing enthusiasm in our congregation for the Lord’s work. “ At this time the Stewardship Committee launched a new program with an emphasis on 5 different goals. The program was titled the “The Life-Style Stewardship Plan.” These five goals were: **Worship** (inviting each individual to join in church community in regular worship and personal worship practiced by each individual); **Study** (inviting individuals to be engaged in both systematic and private study through church school and other church-supported groups); **Service** (enlisting and training members to offer their time and talents in serving God’s people); **Giving** (invite each person to share regularly, sacrificially, and prayerfully in meeting the needs of the church through it’s financial program) **Reconciliation** (to so present Jesus Christ that his offer of life and pardon will be reflected through us, that his people may respond in a renewed love for him and for one another). *(This was taken from the Basic Plan For Stewardship Renewal—May 1978)*

In 1978 the proposed budget was set for \$87,426 for the year. “Congregational giving in 1978 for the General fund purposes was \$83,950 as compared to \$77,467 in 1977. Giving increased by \$2,000 during the first six months and by \$4,500 during the latter half of the year.

All 1978 amounts budgeted for mission concerns and for District dues and benevolences were paid in the total amount of \$9,579. An additional \$1,616 was disbursed for other missions. But, the church at that time was having trouble keeping abreast of their operating expenses.

A girls group was meeting at Emmanuel in 1978 and 79.

They were called the Pioneer Girls. It was a Christ-centered girl’s club program sponsored by local churches. Activities included any thing from Bible study to parties to crafts and service projects. Our own, Ida Ficca, was in charge of the girls in Grades 2 and 3.

During the summer of 1978 there was a program of evening recreation, hymn-sings and movies. A new hymnal was introduced. “Paul didn’t belabor what was accomplished, but he credited all to the power and love of god. So let us thank God for the good which has been done.” \_Pastor Peterson

During this time was when the Trident Submarines came to Kitsap County. It should have been a time of growth for Emmanuel, yet there were members they saw only once or twice a year. The church was in the process of purchasing a van.

1979 was year of transition for Emmanuel. The Associate Pastor, Rev. Les Foss, accepted another call and left in July of that year. With only one pastor lay members such as Mike Claeys and the youth board worked hard to keep the youth program Junior and Senior Luther Leagues going and active.

“A major project during 1979 was becoming acquainted with the new Lutheran Book of Worship. The new service strikes a note of joy. It also emphasizes lay participation, which is Scripturally sound. Worship is not a passive, grandstand spectacle; it is the ministry of all believers in worship of God.” - Pastor Peterson 1979

Emmanuel sponsored another refugee family from Vietnam this year. The Hua family was a real delight to have with the church family. There were special Bible studies provided by the former president of Lutheran Bible Institute (Pastor Eugene Stime). The Summer Sunday evenings were full of recreation and religious films. There was a series of pulpit exchanges with Silverdale Lutheran Church.

Looking to the future the church’s concern was for the youth program. They started a call process for a new associate pastor. With several apartments going up around the church they began to work on an “apartment ministry.” There was also an outreach to inactive members.

Emmanuel Lutheran is a gathering of God’s people who delight in worshiping and serving our Lord. We have been blessed with a wonderful facility that needs upkeep at this time. Our sanctuary and childcare facility furnace has died, and needs to be replaced at this time. The church council has solicited five bids for it’s replacement. The Council has not called for a capital fund campaign, but has chosen to use money the Lord has given us through the normal offerings of His people.

However, the cost of this furnace replacement is anticipated to be somewhere between \$15,000 and \$25,000. We also think it to be prudent to not deplete all of the funds in our bank accounts.

Week 4: Making New Friends


