# Pastor's Message

Holy Week is soon upon us. A story comes to mind.

Two men made a spiritual pilgrimage to the Holy Land to see the spot where Christ was raised. In Jerusalem they made the traditional tour of the beautiful chapel that enclosed the tomb where Jesus was laid and from where He was raised. But there were whispers that this might not be the actual tomb. So they followed an itinerate guide on a difficult walk up a hill, through brambles to a rock clearing. "Here," the guide declared, "Christ was crucified." Then he led them further to another opening where other ancient tombs were found. "Here is where Christ was laid and it was from here that He was raised," declared the guide. It looked plausible to the pilgrims but how did their guide know this was the right location? "Because, the empty tomb is only reached after going through the Cross of Calvary."

This is true of our Worship Schedule, with Palm Sunday/Passion Sunday service, Good Friday service and then the celebration of the Resurrection of Christ.

It is also a true principal in our spiritual lives. We experience Christ's forgiveness and new life when we die with Christ and are raised a new person. This is true for the trials we face too. Surrendering to Christ, we die to

the power our trials have over us and we experience freedom and victory.

Come on Easter Sunday to worship the Lamb of God, but first visit Calvary where we die with Christ to the power of sin.

#### **Our Missionaries**




