# Pastor's Message

When my brothers and I were growing up in Lynden there was often a foot or more of snow during the winter. After one such snow storm Dad decided he could not safely drive to work in Bellingham so he joined us in the front yard to play in the snow. He had grown up in Montana where there was even more snow and where he had learned how to build a snow igloo. No he challenged us to help him make our own igloo. We weren't much help but we did learn by watching him. First he cut blocks of dense snow about 1'x1'x2' in size. He arranged them in a circle for a foundation and filled in the joints with more snow. Then came the second row, slightly offset to the center. When the joints were filled in new row was begun until the process had constructed walls and a roof which stood about five feet tall. An entrance was cut on one side and walls and roof were constructed around it. The exterior was carefully smoothed until Dad was satisfied then the igloo was done. We were thrilled! We climbed on hands and knees into the igloo and sat basking in the presence and love of our father who had made this magnificent snow house for us. The igloo also caught the eye of the local newspaper publisher who photographed it and featured it on the front page of the paper.

In the Gospel of John chapter one God proclaims, "the Word ( meaning the Son of God) became flesh (meaning He became a human being) and dwelt (meaning He tabernacled or housed Himself) among us." The birth of Jesus is God's construction project to erect a house (or igloo) among us where we can come and experience His presence and bask in His love.
