Valentine's Day is February 14, so all you loving husbands are on notice to get ready to romance your wife. Make a plan that centers on her and what she would appreciate. Show her your gratitude for who she is and what she does.

Romantic love defines our Valentine celebrations of today and it is a wonderful way to celebrate Valentine's Day. It reminds us to treasure and support our spouse and to express our love in tangible forms.

Carolyn and I have shared a special tradition on Valentine's Day for many years. We prepare a candlelight dinner with steak, baked potato, and fresh asparagus. We share a glass of wine and a small dessert. We give each other a Valentine card to express our love and often a second card, a funny one (sometimes from the dog or from the cat) to express our joy. We talk about our life together and what the many years have brought us. I buy her flowers. We used to buy each other chocolates but those days are gone. ### Success Brings Success

Last November, *Martha and Mary* provided memory screening opportunities through the Alzheimer's Foundation of America. Many people took the opportunity to get a base-line measurement of cognitive or "working" memory. Most of the people who participated in the 15 minute exercise to test their memory did not need additional follow up and were relieved to learn they scored so well. A low score would have generated advice to have additional screening at their primary care physician's office. Follow up testing by a physician may validate the baseline results for cognition and memory impairment.

Memory screening is especially important to seniors or those who have noticed a decline in their ability to move through their day without excessive time spent in searching for "lost' objects, losing their train of thought mid-sentence or an inability to place familiar faces. These a just some the signs that there may be some memory impairment. Some medications work to slow the progress of continued memory loss, depending on the root cause of the decline. The screening tool used by Martha and Mary can be reviewed with an individual's primary care physician. If a deficit is found, the physician should guide the patient toward further testing, disease progression, medication use and advice about staying independent.

The screening event held last fall was so successful Martha and Mary applied to become a year'round testing site. We are pleased that the Alzheimer's Foundation of America has granted us permission, and provided the appropriate materials, for us to continue the screening throughout the year. Screening will be done by appointment only. For an appointment in Port Orchard, please call the AT HOME office at 360-871-4425. The office is located at 2497 Bethel Road SE. For an appointment in Poulsbo, at the Health & Rehab Center, 19160 Front Street, please call Betty Herman at 360-394-5487. Appointments will be scheduled as time permits but every effort will be made to accommodate your requested time.


