

February 18 is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the season of Lent. This season of repentance and contemplation is commemorated with corporate confession and the Imposition of Ashes in a special 6:30 pm Service. Ashes are symbolic of heartfelt contrition before the holy Lord. You'll recall that Job sat in

sackcloth and ashes to express his submission to God. Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), teaches us not to think that simply applying ashes on our face will suffice. He wants our tongue to confess our sin and our hearts to sense our need for forgiveness. He wants our lives to show that we are contrite. May you walk in harmony with the King as He leads you through this year's Lenten season of your life.

During Lent Jesus leads us to the Cross, the place where He was crucified on our behalf and where we die to self and are made alive to Christ. Presiding Pastor Curtis Leins called us to see beyond ourselves and view the greater work of God in His Kingdom. For our Lenten spiritual discipline Jesus is calling us to give sacrificially to support our seminary students. Please listen for His voice and give generously (As an aside, our member, Rev. Dr. Norm Lund was a professor of our seminary). You may make your contribution in the church offering and simply note that it is for our seminary.

Peace be with you in this Lenten Season of your life.

News from Martha and Mary

J'm So Confused

The Alzheimer's Foundation recently reported "The Advisory Council on Alzheimer's Research, Care and Services, which guides the implementation of the "National Plan to Address Alzheimer's Disease," recommended several items for inclusion in the 2015 plan update. The Secretary of Health and Human Services will ultimately decide which, if any, of the recommendations are included in the update.

The Council's recommendations include: committing research resources with accountability, encouraging development of dementia friendly communities: including care planning in Medicare coverage; incorporating and promoting palliative care choices; expanding services under the Older American's Act to people with early-onset dementia, and establishing a federal panel to suggest innovative financing of long term care services.

The demographics of Kitsap County tell us these recommendations will be very close to home in the near future. We are a graying community! Martha and Mary already has experienced, wise and kind staff attending to those who need the special care people with all forms of dementia need to keep them comfortable and safe. Sometimes their needs are able to be met by our At Home staff supplementing family support. Sometimes living outside the home provides safety for both the patient and the family members. Sleep deprivation is a key factor in recognizing the deterioration of the quality of life of a caregiver and the catalyst for relocation of the person suffering from dementia. The architectural features within Martha & Mary allow the most confused residents to manage their anxiety while often limiting the amount of medication needed to help them feel comfortable.

As a member congregation, Emmanuel Lutheran, supports Martha & Mary's ability to provide services to our community. Your prayers, volunteer hours and financial contributions all are important as we implement additional training for the special needs of these precious residents. Thank You!

A Rich HistoryChapter 24

The year, 1996, marked 50 years for Emmanuel Lutheran Church. A wonderful celebration was held for past and present members and pastors. The following statement came from the invitation that was sent out to former Pastors and Members.

"Hallelujah! Emmanuel Lutheran Church is celebrating its 50th Anniversary. Wow! Half a century ago several Lutherans in the Manette area (many with not church connections), under the direction of Pastor Gordon Trygstad, began Bible studies. They grew in spirit and number and, in December of 1945, they held their first Sunday morning worship service at the J.B. Johnson home. A small altar was made on a card table and Mrs. Ruth Johnson served as organist. What a humble beginning. On February 5th 1946, Manette Lutheran became an organized church, having their first services at 2577 Perry where Pastor Trygstad had moved."

The celebration started on Saturday, February 3rd with an informal open house from 2-4 pm. Sunday was a day of jubilation. It started with the 10 AM worship service and followed by a dinner at noon. Our AALC Presiding Pastor Visits Emmanuel Lutheran


