Pastor's Message

"This New Year, Our Fresh Start, Following Jesus with a Servant Heart"
-Mark 10:35-45

35. And James and John the sons of Zebedee came up to him and said to him, "Teacher we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." 36. And he said to them, "What do you want me to do for you?" 37. And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, on at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." 38 Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" 39. And they said to him, "we are able'. And Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized you will be baptized, 40. But to sit at my right hand, or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." 41. And when the ten heard it, they began to be indignant at James and John. 42. And Jesus called them to him and said to them "You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. 43. But it shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant. 44. And whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. 45. For even the Son of Man came not t be served but to serve. and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:35-45)

A year ago this October, I was working as a cashier at a Home Depot in Snohomish County, Washington. I was making just a dollar or two over what they are now calling minimum wage, and proud to have a full-time job with health benefits and time off for vacation. I worked with many hard-working people as colleagues. Most of us were second or third career employees who had previous goals and education, and were in-between jobs or supplementing retirement. We valued doing our best to "take care of the customer." Like many retail jobs, this would be a combination of daily time and duty disciplines, self-care to keep one's back, knees, shoulders and ankles, loose and free of injury, and finding a pace that was sustainable. We had some true giants in our midst, working well through chronic and regular health or mobility challenges, and these would include the aches and pains that they dealt with each time they arrived for work. Our hours of standing, cement floors and gravity, and long hours were felt by all. We also were aware of those who were half-hearted, and brazenly sought every effort to work conspicuously when the boss was around; and revert to doing as little work as possible otherwise. We knew people like James and John, in our Scripture for this article today, and some not only asked for advancement among their peers, but have also been promoted because of it. In this Gospel, the other ten were "indignant" because it must have seemed such an aggressive and presumptuous "power ask". (Mark 10:41).

Like James and John, I have needed to hear, believe and be challenged to live out what true greatness, giving and love is in God's Kingdom. I need every day to both hear and practice the truth, that, "Whoever would be great among you must be your servant; and to be first among others, we must first be slave of all." (Mark 10:43-44). Then, when I realize Jesus qualifying His own life-giving service, with the very cup that he would drink, and the baptism with which He was baptized, I am even more set back. Can I bear the cross that He did bear, and drink the same cup that He would drink? I am humbled to tears that I have thought myself even remotely worthy. Perhaps Jesus said it most succinctly and powerfully in giving us His own life and ministry plan when he said, "For even the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:45). As a Christian, husband, father, pastor and citizen, as well as servant at all points, I pray the Lord will give me His heart, and courage, along with God's calling to be as Christ unto those to whom I am sent.

Please hear and consider in these verses the promised gift of God in Christ; that indeed, just as James and John were told, our Lord says to us today: "The cup that I drink you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized you will be baptized..." In the very Word of God and the Sacraments, the whole of Jesus' righteousness is given by the grace of God, through faith in Christ, according to His Holy Word. All thanks and Glory be to God, in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen!


Adult Sunday School Study for 2024, "1st, 2nd and 3rd John January 7th—March 17th 9 am in Fellowship Hall

Angel of Mercy

On a cold snowy day in February 1940, a motorist driving through eastern Pennsylvania stopped to provide aid to a man who, while driving too fast, wrecked his car and was lying unconscious in a ditch. The passing motorist took the injured driver to a hospital where the injured driver laid in a coma. Then, finally recovered. Four years later in the winter of 1944 in Germany, the recovered driver, now a captured B-17 pilot was being marched several miles to a pow camp. Exhausted and suffering from the cold he collapsed along the roadside. When he came to, he realized he was being helped by the same person, also a B-17, who had rescued him in Pennsylvania during the winter of 1940. Both men survived the war. After the war, the former pilot who had been rescued twice by the same man was in a deep depression. He had lost his job and was now enjoying what he was sure, because he was broke, was his last meal with all the change he had in his pocket. As he sat there head down, he felt a tap on his shoulder. Looking up, he saw the very same man who had rescued him in Pennsylvania and again in Germany. After a shared meal and words of comfort from



the man who had decided to stop at a small café he had never previously visited on his way to inspect a factory he owned in Harrisburg, the man who had come to the "end of his trail", was offered a job with a weeks pay in advance. This is actually, a true story and, doesn't it remind us of how many times our Lord, by way of the Holy Spirit has intervened in our lives to guide us along life's journey.
