Pastor's Message

This Sunday is *Trinity Sunday*. Unlike other festivals that follow the life of Christ, this festival celebrates the nature of God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit; one God, three persons. This is a central church doctrine but one that does not fit with our reason. How can three persons make one God? Many attempts have been made to explain this mystery. The three leaf clover and the three parts of the egg are two examples. These and all other explanations fail. The Trinity is a doctrine beyond our grasp. It is best to accept it by faith.

So why do we hold to a doctrine that defies reason? The answer is because, first, Scripture teaches it, and second, because it protects the deity of the three persons from humanistic attacks.

This Sunday we shall recite the Nicene Creed, which is based on the doctrine of the Trinity, and we shall sing songs to glorify the God who is three persons and yet one God. Come and join the praise!

A Federal Income Tax Tip for Seniors

If you are over 70 1/2 years old, have a traditional IRA, and are not able to itemize deductions, you can reduce your tax by taking advantage of a qualified charitable distribution. Instead of giving your usual offering to Emmanuel Lutheran Church, you can instruct the trustee of your IRA to make a distribution of that amount directly to Emmanuel Lutheran Church.
