A Rich History of 66 years

Chapter seven

If you look at the roster for the 1977 Council and VBS staff you would recognize many of the names on these lists. For instance, Kay Kannitzer was the council secretary that year. Larry Ficca was the chairman for Property and Management, Sylvia Boyce was on the Board of Stewardship, and Evelyn Stouffer and Marilyn Boekenoogen served on the Board of Education. The VBS Superintendent was Carol Henning in 1977. Ida Ficca taught the 1st grade class for VBS. Back in "77" VBS ran for two weeks. With 100 children enrolled, the average attendance was 70 each day. The theme was "Reach Out"- Sharing the Story of Jesus. "The series was planned to help the children grow in their understanding of God's outreach and to help them respond by reaching out to others with His love."

It looked like the youth program was, once again, alive and well. The Senior League had quite a few activities planned for the summer. They started out with a retreat to Ocean Shores followed up with a backpacking trip in July. To help raise money to send delegates to the fall convention, three car washes were planned as well as a rummage sale. They went to North West Trek in September. Through the summer they continued their Weekly Bible studies and youth nights on Wednesdays at Lutherhaven.

There was a new direction for Confirmation classes in 1977. It was called the "Individualized Approach to Confirmation". "There were no formal lectures, and no classroom situations. Instead, each student was given a learning package (with 6–8 performance objectives to finish) to complete before going on to the next learning package. (there were 8 learning packages to be completed in a year. Cassette tapes, filmstrips, tape players, filmstrip viewers, exercise sheets, books, and their own Bibles were just some of the materials used. A Learning Resource Center was open in the basement of the church every Wednesday from 4:00–8:00. A dinner was held for the youth each Wednesday as well as youth choir practice. The mothers of the confirmation students took turns providing the dinners. The students paid either \$6.00 for the year or \$1.00 for each learning package.

Pastor Les Foss's daughter, Cheryl, was the Kitsap Peninsula's champion in the National Spelling Bee in Washington DC.

The women's groups continued to be very active. The Lydia Circle worked on church history books at the Boyce's home. (These are the very books that I am using to retype the history of our church.) Thank you ladies, for all your hard work. They also visited local nursing homes. The Quilting circle produced 29 quilts this year. They were

dedicated in October of 1977 and set to Lutheran World Relief to be sent all over the world.

Education was emphasized during 1977. Sixty members attended at "Church Growth" Seminar. They were inspired as instructed in God's will for the church to grow. The main focus of this effort was on the Sunday School. Several members attended worship and music institutes. Special groups were brought to the church to inspire the members. This year brought the resignation of Helen Strom, the church secretary that served for over 17 years.

Between the years 1978–1979, a group called the Pioneer Girls meant at Emmanuel Lutheran. It gave girls the opportunity to put Christ in every phase of their lives. This organization included girls from 1st grade–12th grade.

In 1978 there was "a greater program for the summer—Sunday School and Sunday evening recreation, hymn sings and movies." A new stewardship program was introduced called Life-Style Stewardship. The new "Green" Lutheran Book of Worship was introduced. The pastor at that time (Pastor Peterson) felt that more of an emphasis needed to happen when it came to finances and evangelical outreach. During this time the congregation was contributing money towards the purchase of a van.

In July of 1978 the associate pastor, Pastor Leslie Foss received a call and left Emmanuel. Fortunately lay people in the congregation were able to step up and help keep the youth program going. This was something that Pastor Foss had worked very hard to build up. During this year Emmanuel was able to reach out and sponsor another refugee family from Vietnam.

Join our VBS Caravan !


Get ready for the journey of a lifetime as our Vacation Bible School goes on an
